Ann:

Following up on our call, here are some explanations and questions relative to your email below and the regulatory proposal we sent this AM:

Reciprocal Licensing

Under the IDFPR change, retired providers or providers whose license lapsed are being allowed to practice, but they still need to fill out an application and get licensed. While it says the applications will be expedited, we are not sure what that means. It would be more effective for purposes of the crisis to have them able to practice while this is pending or have 90 days after they start practicing to get licensed.

Waivers on Facilities

For the IDPH waiver piece, is IDPH still requiring change notifications but reviewing them once received from existing facilities within 24 hours? We just want to clarify if we are expected to keep updating IDPH every time we change something, e.g. add beds or change the type of bed, as it would be far more effective during the crisis to have a broader waiver that would allow such relatively minor changes within certain parameters for some longer period of time.



As to the general requests for emergency funding assistance we have made (like the IHA and others), we have an idea relative to Medicaid arrearage and private payer reimbursements. Payments from public and private payers are dramatically down during this period, yet private payers still collect

premiums and Medicaid is around 300 days in arrears. We have some ideas relating to that dynamic and imbalance and how the Governor could help address the funding problem for hospitals and providers during the crisis. Our current CEO, Dr Omar Lateef, a critical care pulmonologist, and our former CEO, Dr Larry Goodman, an infectious disease specialist, would like to see if they could WebEx with the Governor and your office and discuss the data and projections and this emergency funding idea.

Ann, any help you could provide on this would be most appreciated. Let me know what you think and if you can help arrange something. Your office has been incredibly helpful already and we thank you for that as we meet the pandemic head on.

Thank you for sending this – it's incredibly helpful to have Rush's issues all in one place. As I mentioned when we called a few minutes ago, our office is also working with IHA on the longer list of issues.

Just to follow up on a few of the issues you raised:

The reciprocal licensing (page 11) is done, with the temporary application available on IDFPR's website. If your colleagues think what we've done does not fully address this issue, please let us know so we can follow up. The issues relating to wavier of specific hospital facility requirements (page 13) are currently being worked on at IDPH. They should be at a 24-hour turnaround for changes to existing facilities and will keep moving faster on that as needed. Anna will follow up with IDPH on the issues around new/temporary locations. With regard to the long term acute care/skilled nursing facilities issue (page 17), it's my understanding that

the long term care association and hospitals have started to discuss this. We expect to get updates and will dive in as needed. Finally, on telehealth (page 18), I just asked two of my colleagues to look right away at the requested expansion of the telehealth changes in EO-7. Let's discuss the liability issue when you have a chance to send more info. We are researching that on our end as well.

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



Additional Request

As to the general requests for emergency funding assistance we have made (like the IHA and others), we have an idea relative to Medicaid arrearage and private payer reimbursements. In anticipation of our call, I am sharing the three concepts that we would like to discuss with you. If it would be helpful, we have prepared language for each of these that I would be happy to share with you. We look forward to talking with you shortly.

- 1. <u>Liability Protections</u>: Healthcare professionals and hospitals are working under difficult and unprecedented circumstances. They are coordinating closely with the State and your office to ensure that they are there to care for all Illinois residents and communities for the duration of this outbreak, including risking their own lives. They must rest assured that while providing critical lifesaving care during the crisis such as providing care in National Guard established triage centers that they are not exposing themselves to increased liability claims. Instead, their good faith actions, should be given the liability protections that are typically provided under existing state (e.g., Illinois Emergency Management Agency Act (IEMA) (20 ILCS 3305/21(c)); Immunity from Civil Liability Statute (210 ILCS 50/33.150(a)) and federal laws. An executive order from your office, extending and ensuring that the limited liability provisions of these laws cover the services they render on behalf of the State, will reassure our healthcare providers and allow them to focus on the job at hand saving lives.
- 2. Intra-State Reciprocal Licensure: The Governor's March 19th Executive Order and the Illinois Department of Financial and Professional Regulations' (IDFPR) variance to allow physicians, nurses, physician assistants and respiratory therapists, who are licensed and in good standing, to obtain temporary licenses in Illinois on an expedited basis was a needed first step, but it should be broadened to include the full range of healthcare professionals who may be needed during this crisis pharmacists, pharmacy technicians, physical and occupational therapists, clinical professional and professional counselors, clinical and professional psychologists, dieticians, social workers, home medical equipment and service providers. Broaching your initial order in this way will ensure that all healthcare professionals from across the country who may be available and ready to assist are able to do so.

We know that IDFPR is also looking at the above, but wanted to discuss with you as well since it relates to the liability issue.

3. **Reciprocal Credentialing and Privileging**: Having the flexibility to easily utilize healthcare providers who are only credentialed at one facility at other facilities as well is also critically important during this period. Specifically, if Hospital A experiences a surge in COVID-19 patients, healthcare providers from other hospitals who may have available staff should be able to assist the overwhelmed hospitals by making their staffs available to Hospital A. Normally, before such staff could provide assistance at Hospital A, Hospital A would need to review and approve their credentials – a lengthy process. Given the urgency of the current situation, Hospital A should be allowed to rely on the credentialing done by the other hospitals and be able to immediately onboard staff from other hospitals. This will allow hospitals and healthcare professionals to assist each other and provide critical lifesaving staffing during the surge period.

We believe that this issue would fall under IDPH as part of the Hospital Licensing Act / UI Hospital Licensing Act requirements, but wanted to discuss with you well since it relates to the liability issues



Following up on our call, here are some explanations and questions relative to your email below and the regulatory proposal we sent this AM:
Reciprocal Licensing

Under the IDFPR change, retired providers or providers whose license lapsed are being allowed to practice, but they still need to fill out an application and get licensed. While it says the applications will be expedited, we are not sure what that means. It would be more effective for purposes of the crisis to have them able to practice while this is pending or have 90 days after they start practicing to get licensed. Waivers on Facilities

For the IDPH waiver piece, is IDPH still requiring change notifications but reviewing them once received from existing facilities within 24 hours? We just want to clarify if we are expected to keep updating IDPH every time we change something, e.g. add beds or change the type of bed, as it would be far more effective during the crisis to have a broader waiver that would allow such relatively minor changes within certain parameters for some longer period of time.





As to the general requests for emergency funding assistance we have made (like the IHA and others), we have an idea relative to Medicaid arrearage and private payer reimbursements. Payments from public and private payers are dramatically down during this period, yet private payers still collect premiums and Medicaid is around 300 days in arrears. We have some ideas relating to that dynamic and imbalance and how the Governor could help address the funding problem for hospitals and providers during the crisis. Our current CEO, Dr Omar Lateef, a critical care pulmonologist, and our former CEO, Dr Larry Goodman, an infectious disease specialist, would like to see if they could WebEx with the Governor and your office and discuss the data and projections and this emergency funding idea.

Ann, any help you could provide on this would be most appreciated. Let me know what you think and if you can help arrange something. Your office has been incredibly helpful already and we thank you for that as we meet the pandemic head on.

Thank you for sending this – it's incredibly helpful to have Rush's issues all in one place. As I mentioned when we called a few minutes ago, our office is also working with IHA on the longer list of issues. Just to follow up on a few of the issues you raised:

The reciprocal licensing (page 11) is done, with the temporary application available on IDFPR's website. If your colleagues think what we've done does not fully address this issue, please let us know so we can follow up. The issues relating to wavier of specific hospital facility requirements (page 13) are currently being worked on at IDPH. They should be at a 24-hour turnaround for changes to existing facilities and will keep moving faster on that as needed. Anna will follow up with IDPH on the issues around new/temporary locations. With regard to the long term acute care/skilled nursing facilities issue (page 17), it's my understanding that the long term care association and hospitals have started to discuss this. We expect to get updates and will dive in as needed. Finally, on telehealth (page 18), I just asked two of my colleagues to look right away at the requested expansion of the telehealth changes in EO-7.

Let's discuss the liability issue when you have a chance to send more info. We are researching that on our end as well.




Following up on our call, here are some explanations and questions relative to your email below and the regulatory proposal we sent this AM:

Reciprocal Licensing

Under the IDFPR change, retired providers or providers whose license lapsed are being allowed to practice, but they still need to fill out an application and get licensed. While it says the applications will be expedited, we are not sure what that means. It would be more effective for purposes of the crisis to have them able to practice while this is pending or have 90 days after they start practicing to get licensed.

Waivers on Facilities

For the IDPH waiver piece, is IDPH still requiring change notifications but reviewing them once received from existing facilities within 24 hours? We just want to clarify if we are expected to keep updating IDPH every time we change something, e.g. add beds or change the type of bed, as it would be far more effective during the crisis to have a broader waiver that would allow such relatively minor changes within certain parameters for some longer period of time.





As to the general requests for emergency funding assistance we have made (like the IHA and others), we have an idea relative to Medicaid arrearage and private payer reimbursements. Payments from public and private payers are dramatically down during this period, yet private payers still collect premiums and Medicaid is around 300 days in arrears. We have some ideas relating to that dynamic and imbalance and how the Governor could help address the funding problem for hospitals and providers during the crisis. Our current CEO, Dr Omar Lateef, a critical care pulmonologist, and our former CEO, Dr Larry Goodman, an infectious disease specialist, would like to see if they could WebEx with the Governor and your office and discuss the data and projections and this emergency funding idea. Ann, any help you could provide on this would be most appreciated. Let me know what you think and if you can help arrange something. Your office has been incredibly helpful already and we thank you for that as we meet the pandemic head on.

Following up on our call, here are some explanations and questions relative to your email below and the regulatory proposal we sent this AM:

Reciprocal Licensing

Under the IDFPR change, retired providers or providers whose license lapsed are being allowed to practice, but they still need to fill out an application and get licensed. While it says the applications will be expedited, we are not sure what that means. It would be more effective for purposes of the crisis to have them able to practice while this is pending or have 90 days after they start practicing to get licensed.

Waivers on Facilities

For the IDPH waiver piece, is IDPH still requiring change notifications but reviewing them once received from existing facilities within 24 hours? We just want to clarify if we are expected to keep updating IDPH every time we change something, e.g. add beds or change the type of bed, as it would be far more effective during the crisis to have a broader waiver that would allow such relatively minor changes within certain parameters

for some longer period of time.



As to the general requests for emergency funding assistance we have made (like the IHA and others), we have an idea relative to Medicaid arrearage and private payer reimbursements. Payments from public and private payers are dramatically down during this period, yet private payers still collect premiums and Medicaid is around 300 days in arrears. We have some ideas relating to that dynamic and imbalance and how the Governor could help address the funding problem for hospitals and providers during the crisis. Our current CEO, Dr Omar Lateef, a critical care pulmonologist, and our former CEO, Dr Larry Goodman, an infectious disease specialist, would like to see if they could WebEx with the Governor and your office and discuss the data and projections and this emergency funding idea.

Ann, any help you could provide on this would be most appreciated. Let me know what you think and if you can help arrange something. Your office has been incredibly helpful already and we thank you for that as we meet the pandemic head on.

Thank you for sending this – it's incredibly helpful to have Rush's issues all in one place. As I mentioned when we called a few minutes ago, our office is also working with IHA on the longer list of issues. Just to follow up on a few of the issues you raised:

The reciprocal licensing (page 11) is done, with the temporary application available on IDFPR's website. If your colleagues think what we've done does not fully address this issue, please let us know so we can follow up. The issues relating to wavier of specific hospital facility requirements (page 13) are currently being worked on at IDPH. They should be at a 24-hour turnaround for changes to existing facilities and will keep moving faster on that as needed. Anna will follow up with IDPH on the issues around new/temporary locations. With regard to the long term acute care/skilled nursing facilities issue (page 17), it's my understanding that the long term care association and hospitals have started to discuss this. We expect to get updates and will dive in as needed. Finally, on telehealth (page 18), I just asked two of my colleagues to look right away at the requested expansion of the telehealth changes in EO-7.

Let's discuss the liability issue when you have a chance to send more info. We are researching that on our end as well.






